**REGISTRATION FORM - PSYCHOPHARMACOLOGY 2007**

You are invited to participate in a conference on Psychopharmacological and Psychosocial Strategies in children and adolescents who are difficult to treat and do not respond to the usual treatments associated with their psychiatric diagnosis. This conference will present practical approaches to treatment resistance which are based on clinical experience and the limited evidence from the anecdotal and evidence based literature. The presentations by experts in their field will be both didactic and focused on case presentations, with opportunity to have clinical discussions in formal and informal interaction with the speakers. There will be a focus on evaluation and treatment of comorbidity, differences in epigenetic variants and NOS diagnostic categories. Pharmacological strategies such as combinations of medications, augmentation strategies and the use of blood levels will be presented. Psychosocial strategies including issues in individual psychotherapy, cognitive behavioral therapy and family treatment strategies will be explored.

Attending this Conference will increase your skills in evaluating and making appropriate psychopharmacological and therapeutic treatment plans for these children and adolescents who are difficult to assess, manage and treat. The Conference has been designed for child, adolescent and adult psychiatrists, pediatricians, pediatric neurologists, psychologists, psychotherapists and trainees who treat these children and adolescents with treatment resistant psychiatric conditions.
